#### Emergency Management CERT Training scheduled for January-March 2025

The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program educates volunteers about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area



and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations.

The program is regulated by the Federal Emergency Management Agency and standardized nationwide. Certification training consists of seven mandatory three-hour classroom sessions and a four-hour final disaster simulation exercise.

Class #3 begins on Thursday, January 23rd, and runs through Thursday, March 13th. We invite you to join our <u>interest list</u> to receive registration information and updates on upcoming training opportunities. RSM Residents who have completed CERT Training elsewhere and hold certification are invited to join our team. Please complete an <u>application</u>, and we will contact you with volunteer opportunities and refresher training classes.

#### **Home Burglary Prevention Tips for the End of Daylight Savings Time**

With daylight savings ending and nights arriving earlier, burglars may find more opportunities under the cover of darkness. Rancho Santa Margarita Police Services offers these tips to help keep your home secure during this season:

- 1. **Enhance Your Lighting:** Keep the outside of your home well-lit, especially around doors and windows. Motion-sensor lights and smart bulbs on timers can help deter unwanted activity.
- 2. **Be Mindful of Deliveries:** Packages left outside your home signal that no one is present. Schedule deliveries when someone is home or use a secure pick-up location.
- 3. Lock It Up: Always lock doors and windows, even if you're only stepping out briefly. This simple step often deters burglars looking for an easy target.
- 4. **Maintain Landscaping:** Trim trees and bushes around entry points to reduce hiding spots. Clear sightlines make it easier for neighbors to spot suspicious activity.
- 5. **Keep Valuables Out of Sight:** Avoid leaving valuables, including electronics and packages, visible from outside. Use curtains or blinds, especially in rooms with large windows.
- 6. **Avoid Posting Your Plans Online:** Sharing your travel or holiday plans on social media can make your home a target. Wait until you're back to share those moments.
- 7. **Install Security Cameras:** Visible cameras serve as a deterrent and can provide valuable footage if a crime occurs. Many smart cameras even alert you to unusual activity.
- 8. **Get to Know Your Neighbors:** Trusted neighbors can monitor each other's homes and report suspicious behavior. Consider joining or starting a Neighborhood Watch group.

Stay vigilant and help keep Rancho Santa Margarita safe! If you see any suspicious activity, report it to our non-emergency line, or dial 911 in an emergency.
