OCCS uses a three part approach to preventing and solving crimes.

- First, they empower the community by providing a safe and anonymous way to report criminal activity. Secondly, Crime Stoppers partners with all forms of media to inform the community on how to anonymously report crimes. Law enforcement is the final piece; they follow-up on tips from community members.
- The Crime Stoppers program is funded by private donations and annual fundraising events. NO TAX DOLLARS are involved. The reward money is funded completely from OCCS events and donations from concerned citizens and businesses.
